Download your next book...

If you have a smart phone, iPad, or computer you can get your next book delivered electronically to your device. All you need is your Warren County Library card and you have access to thousands of eBooks and eAudiobooks.

DigitalLibraryNJ Our library partners with other libraries in the state to purchase a collection of eBooks and eAudiobooks. Titles and instructions for downloading books can be found on the Digital LibraryNJ site. Titles are listed in our library catalog as an electronic resource. If a title has a waiting list, you can put a reserve on the title. Don't be discouraged if there are a lot of reserves on a title. Warren County Library purchases additional copies of many popular titles. These copies are available to Warren County Library members only, which results in a shorter wait time.

OneClickDigital primarily offers eAudiobooks, but also provides access to eBook versions of classic books. Bestselling books and books for young readers are included in the eAudiobook collection. You can find titles in our online catalog, or on the OneClickDigital site. Listen to an eAudiobook while you walk, do housework, or drive and find new time to enjoy reading.

Tumblebooks provides access to online versions of eBooks for children and young adults. Tumblebooks features animated storybooks for the youngest readers and has read-a-long chapter books for early readers. Games, puzzles, and videos are included to keep kids interested. Some titles in Spanish and French are also available.

Tumblebook Cloud is for young adult readers and includes fiction,

non-fiction, drama, poetry, Graphic novels, and audiobooks. Titles are available as online eBooks, read-a-long books, or audiobooks. Titles are always available, so it is a great resource for students. Some titles include quizzes to help students review their reading, streamed performances of plays and movies, and lesson plans for teachers. Brief National Geographic videos on a variety of topics are also available to watch.

Zinio - Sign up for a free subscription to one of our many eMagazine subscriptions. Issues are always available and can be downloaded to your phone, tablet, or computer. Never be without something to read and go green with an electronic rather than paper subscription.

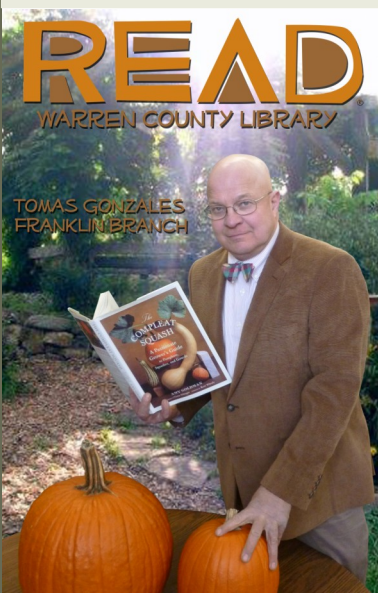

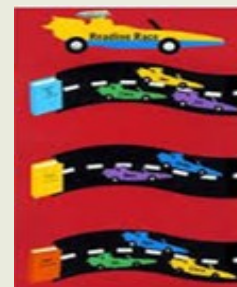

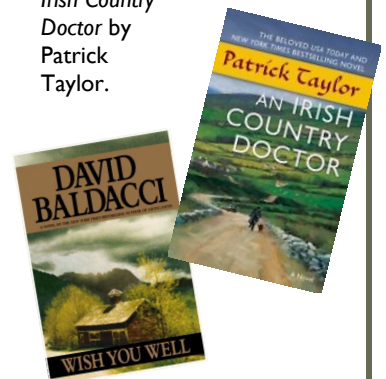
