## Why we still need libraries...

I recently attended a meeting and was asked about the future of libraries. Can't people get everything they need from the internet? Aren't printed library materials obsolete?

While this person understood that the world had changed, they failed to realize that libraries had also changed. We buy eBooks in addition to printed books, offer streaming movies in addition to DVDs, downloadable music and audiobooks in addition to the same content on CD.

Our reference collection still exists, however, we now offer online databases that can be used from any computer with internet. Librarians are switching from using print to electronic content, too...and yes...we even use the internet. In a world where the internet has become the dominant way to find information, your librarian is an expert that can navigate the web and find the information you need from the millions of web results.

Libraries have always supported literacy and learning with printed materials and programming. Our new literacy challenge is digital. Without digital literacy—the skills to use devices such as computers, smart phones and tablets—people are not able to function in a society that has moved to more online information and data gathering and are isolated from modern communication. We help people bridge this gap every day by providing computers and WiFi and by offering classes and one-on-one assistance with computers, smart phones, tablets and software. We have recently purchased a 3D printer for public use and we will be adding other equipment and software in the Makerspace at our new facility opening in Greenwich Township. Access to these new technologies offers people the knowledge and skills they need for school, employment and their personal lives.

As depositories of information, libraries have always

held printed knowledge and historical materials, and continue to do so in addition to now creating new sources for information and ways to learn through expanded areas of programming (such as STEAM) and Makerspaces. These endeavors bring people together to learn, share ideas, and create. From traditional skills such as knitting to more modern interests like coding—libraries now provide a source of information for the community. Library groups and clubs expand the knowledge and skills of the individual and provide a sense of community among members.

Today's libraries are no longer quiet reading rooms monitored by a "shushing" librarian. They are the heart of our community, a hub of activity and place of discovery. Spread the word...
